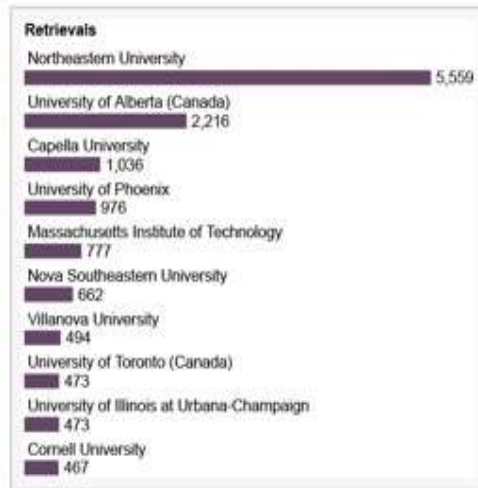

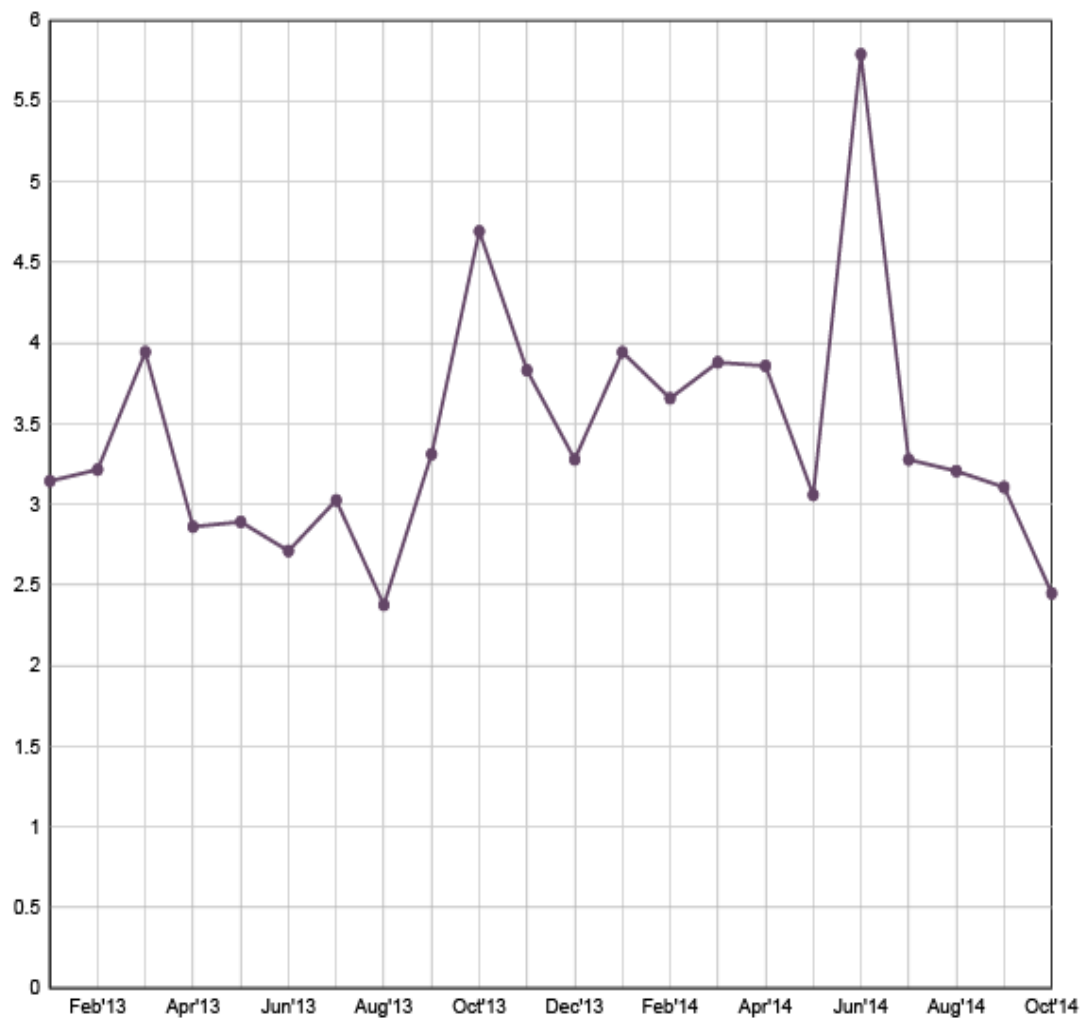

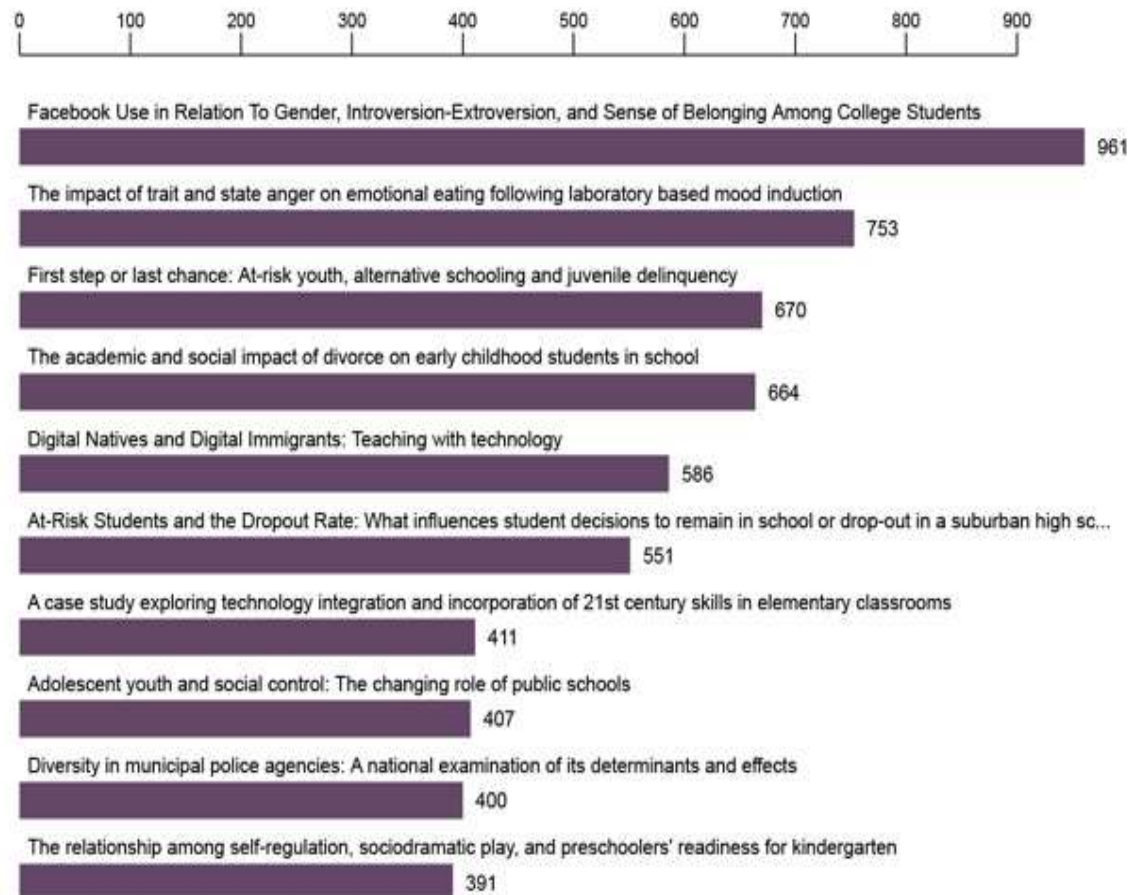

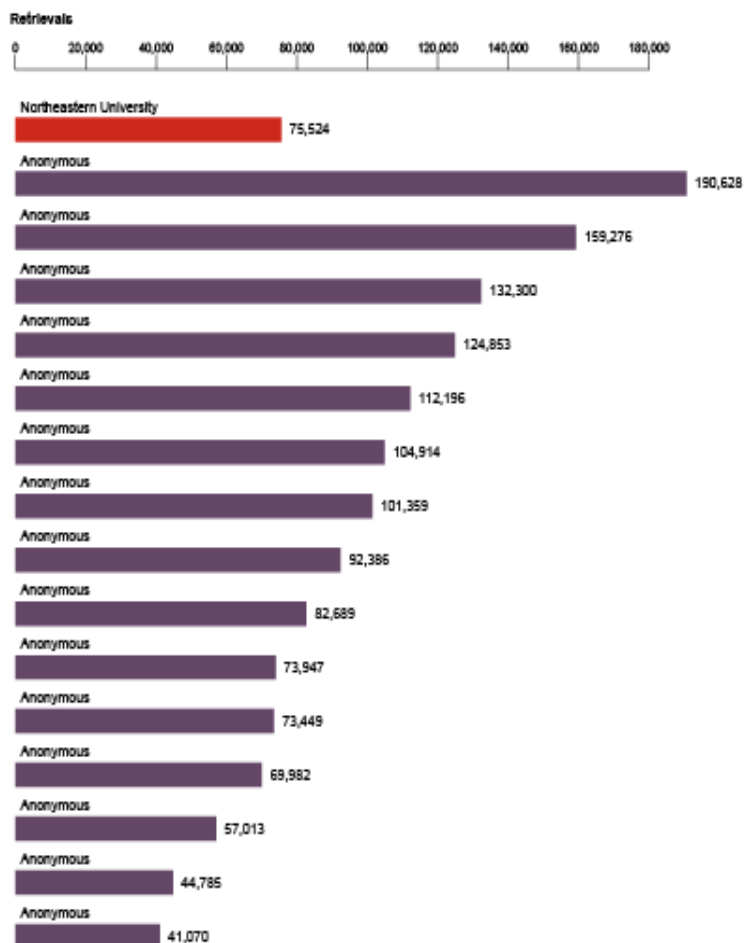

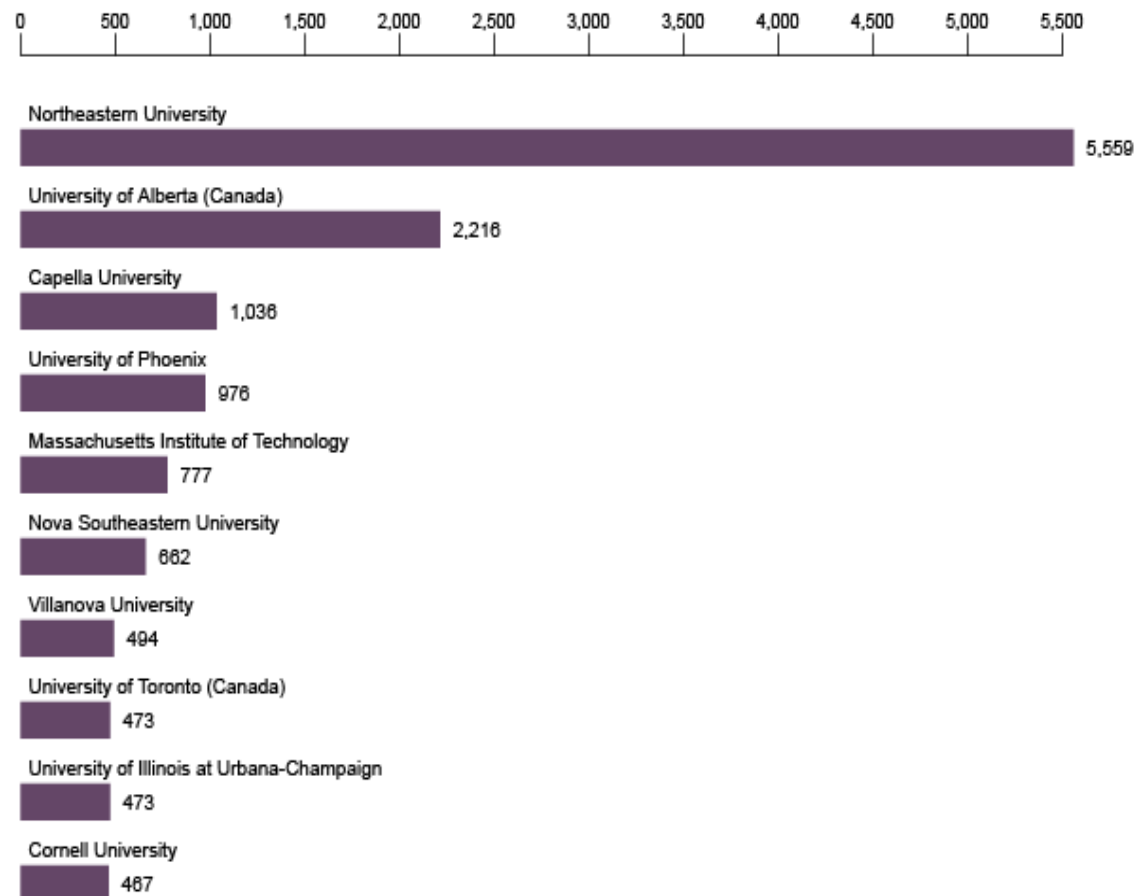

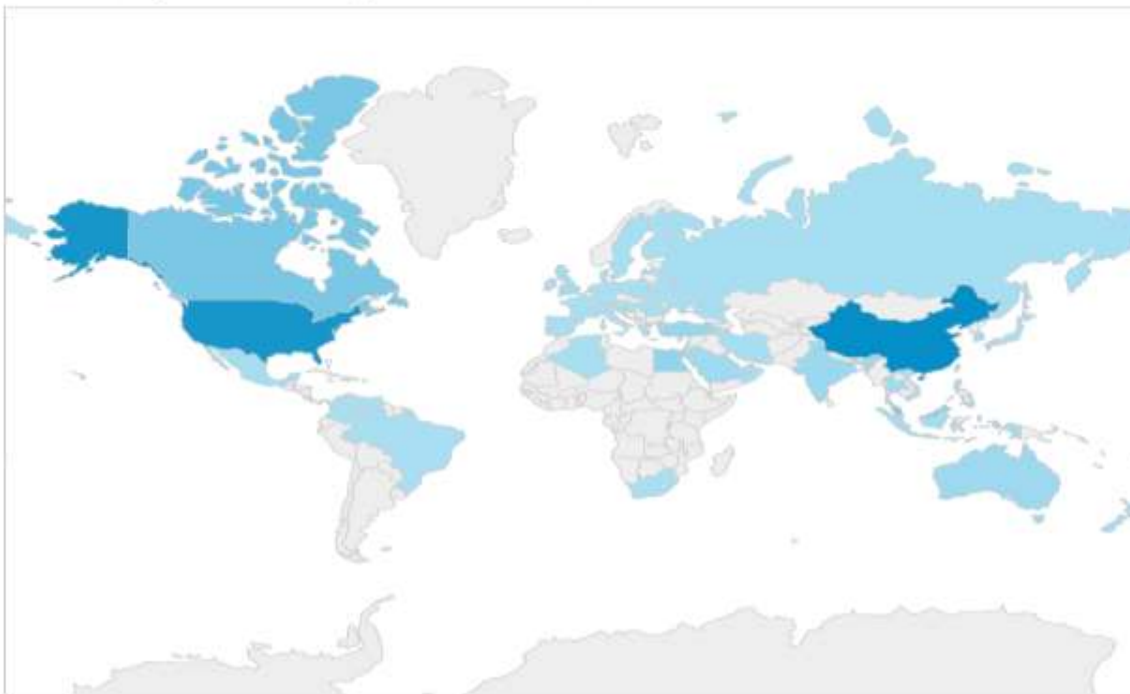

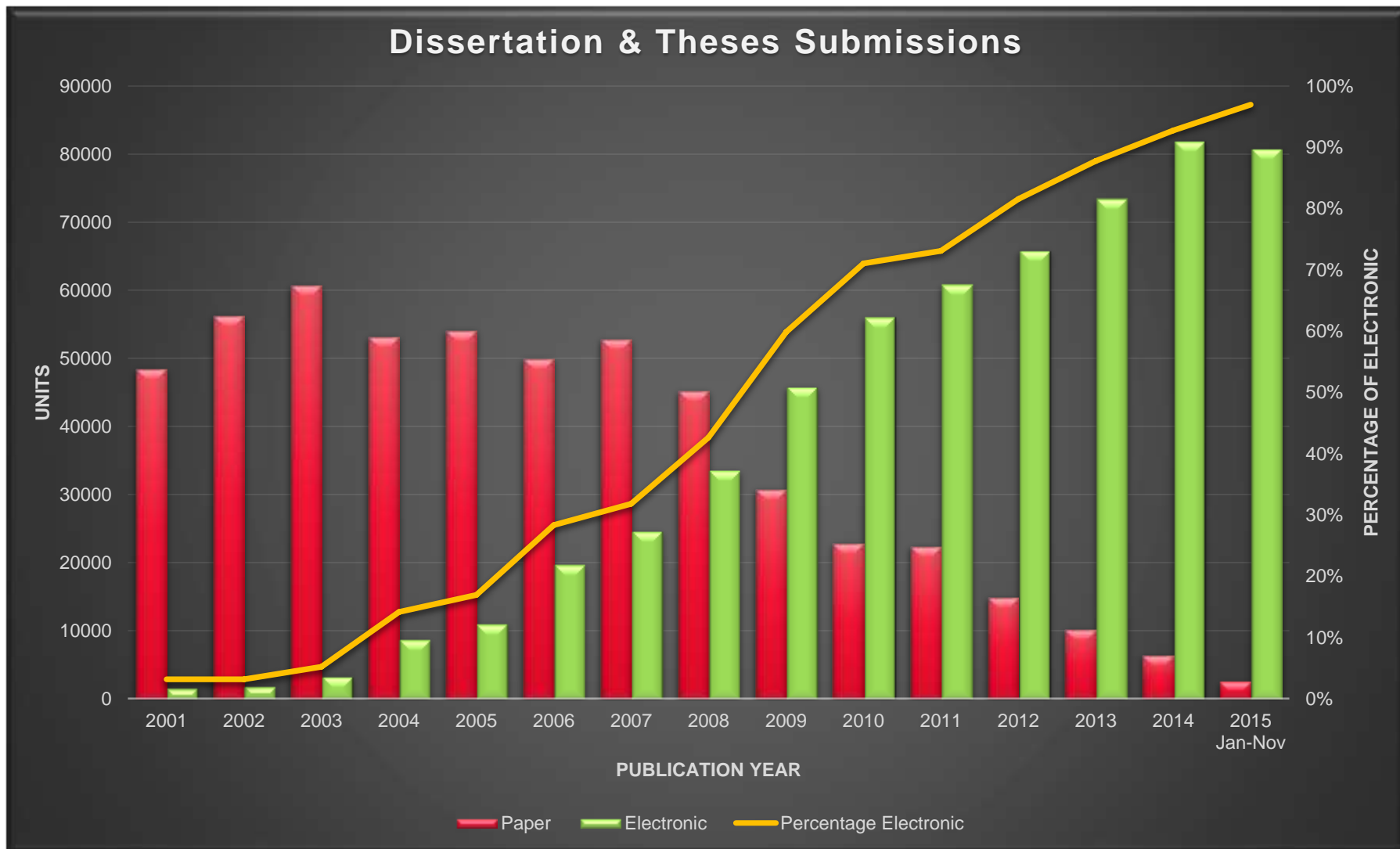

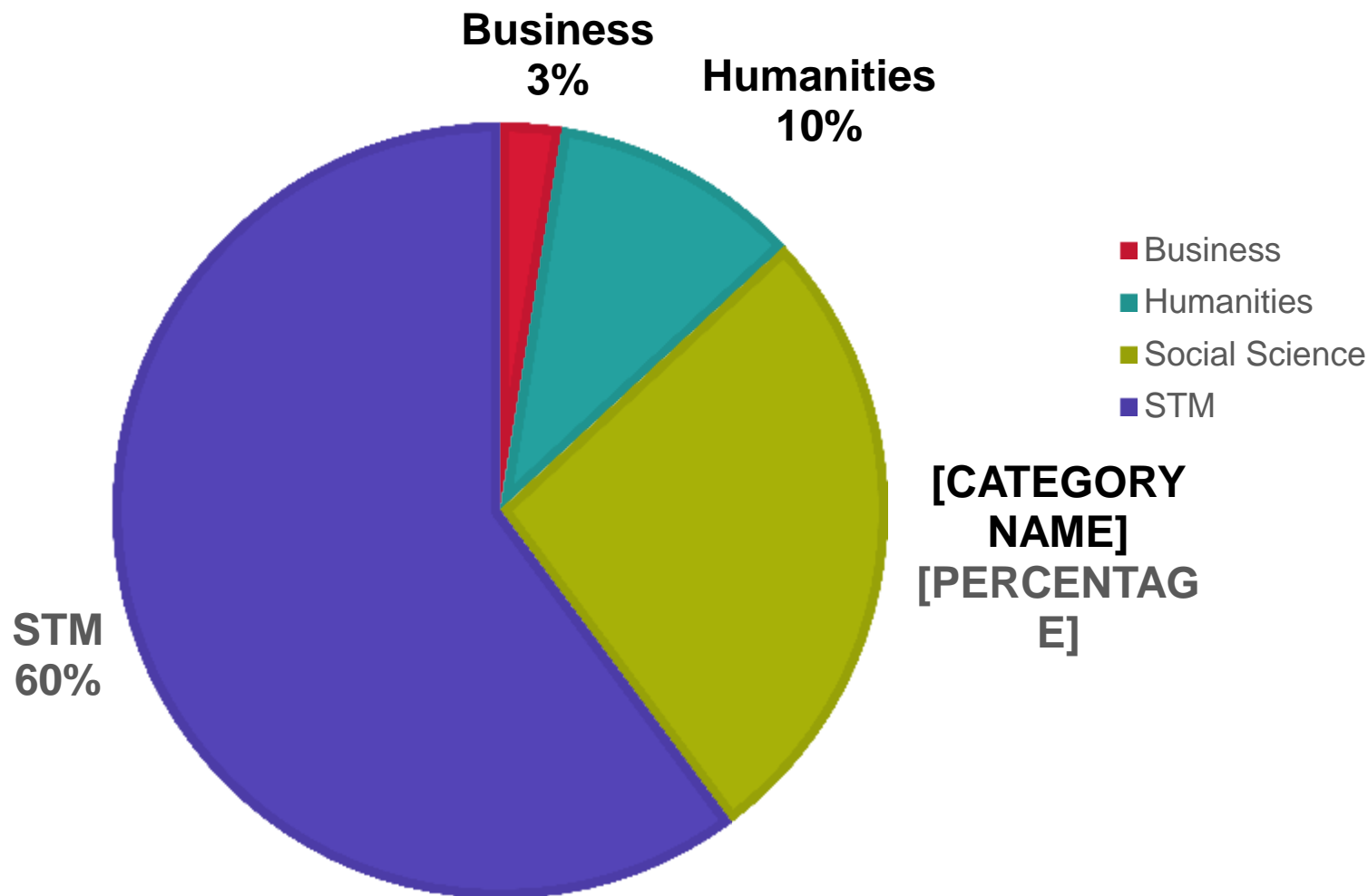

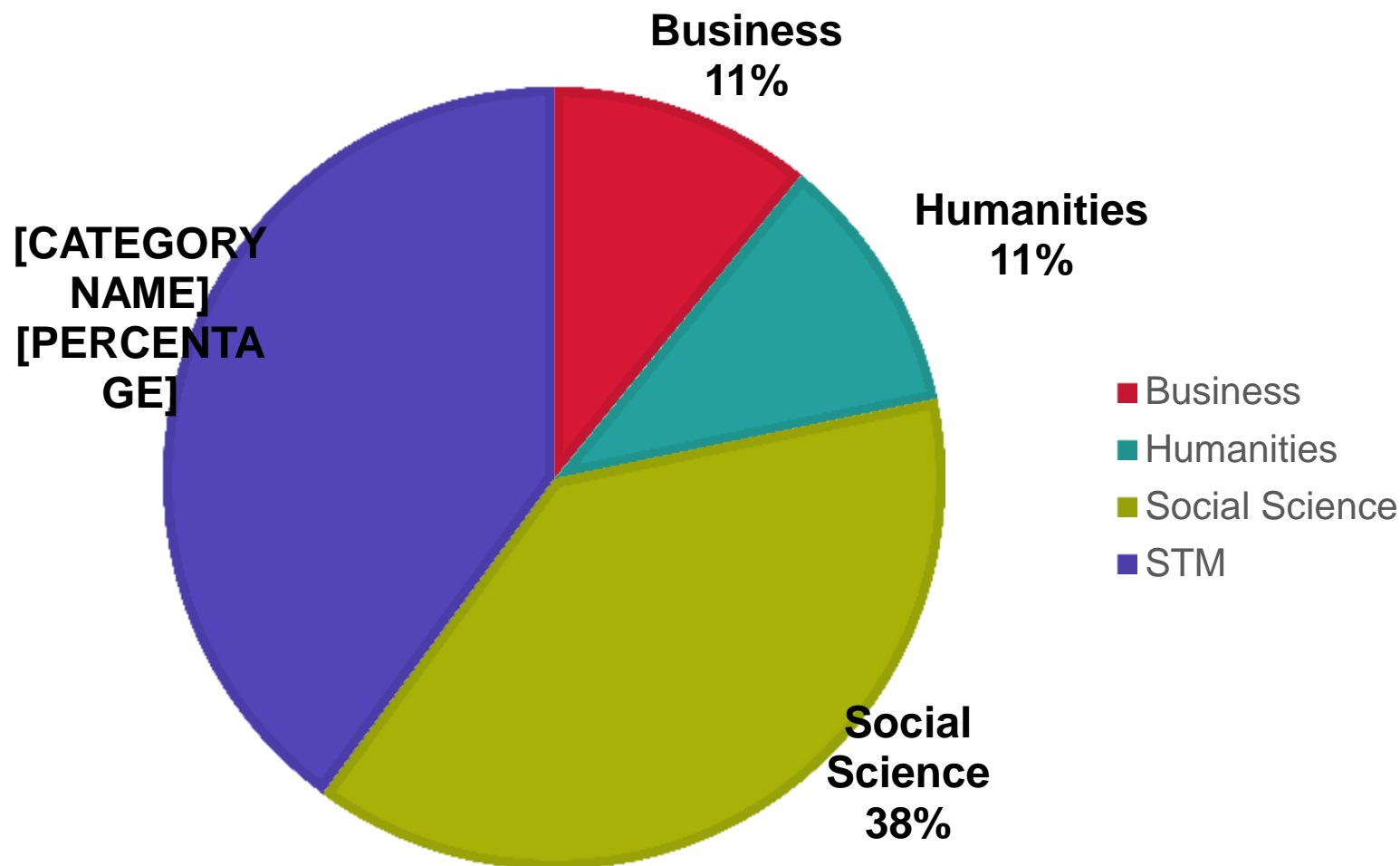
Growth of ETDs



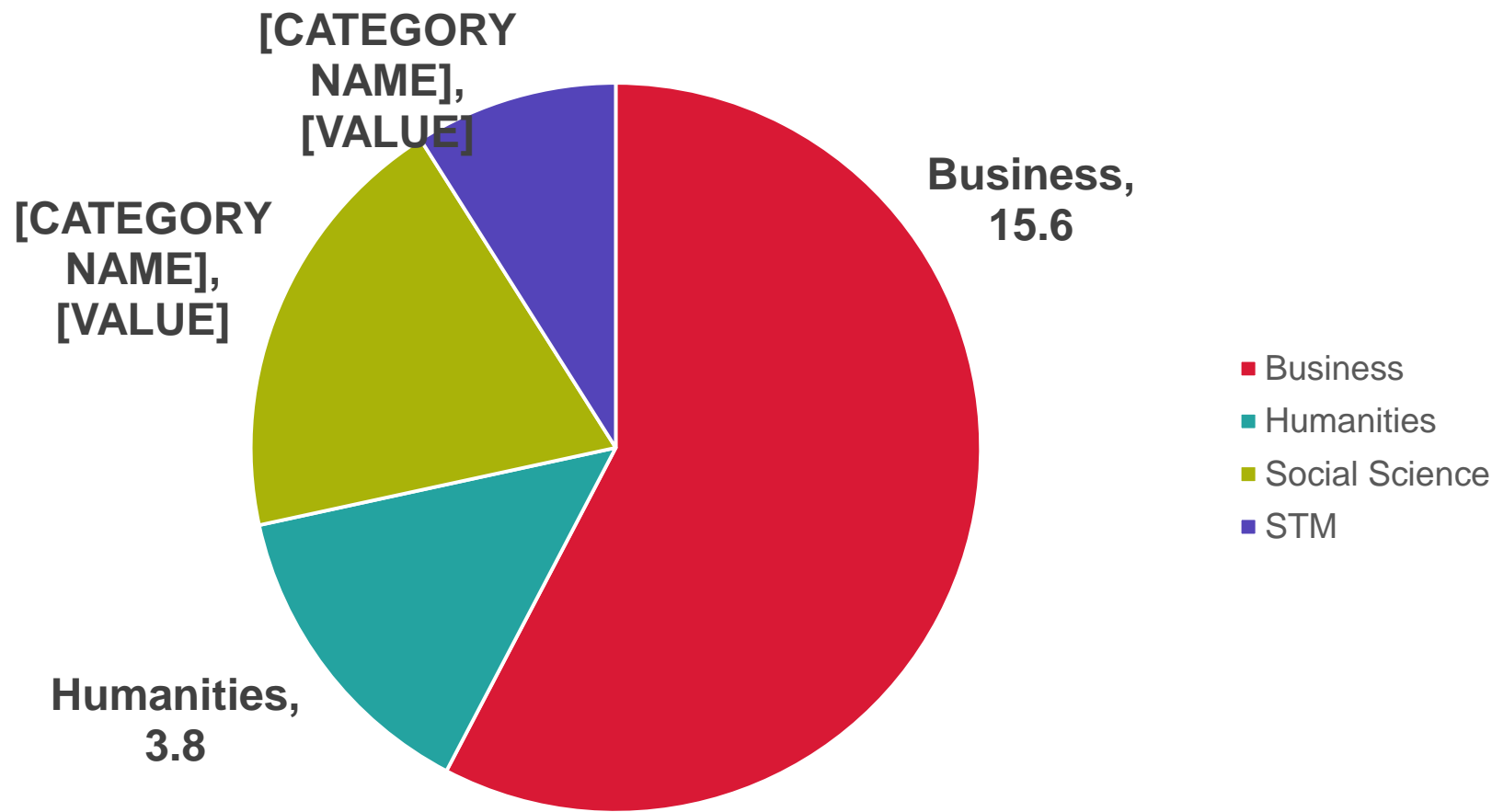
ProQuest Total Dissertation Content by Broad Subject Area



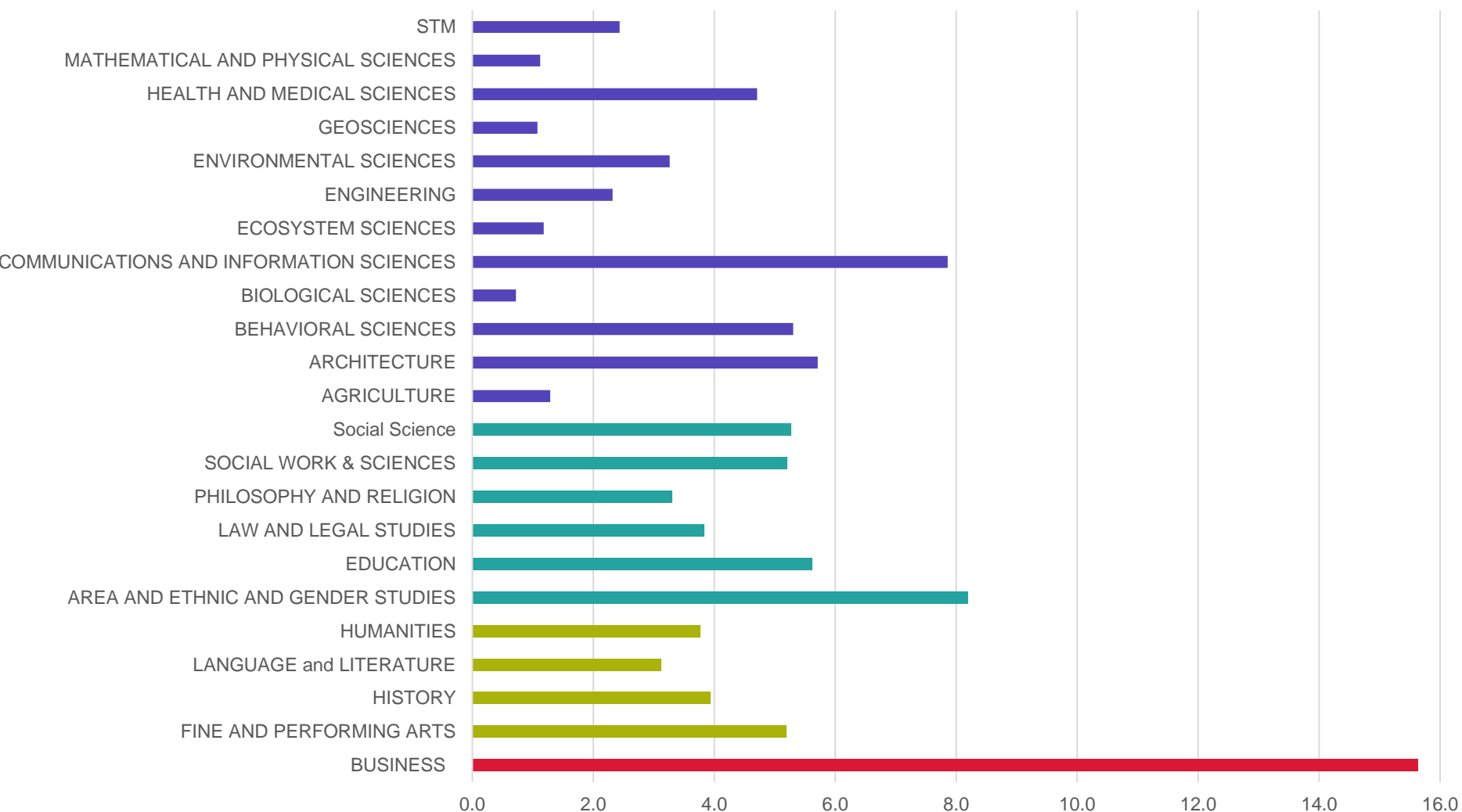
ProQuest Total Dissertation Downloads by Broad Subject Area (2014 – Current)



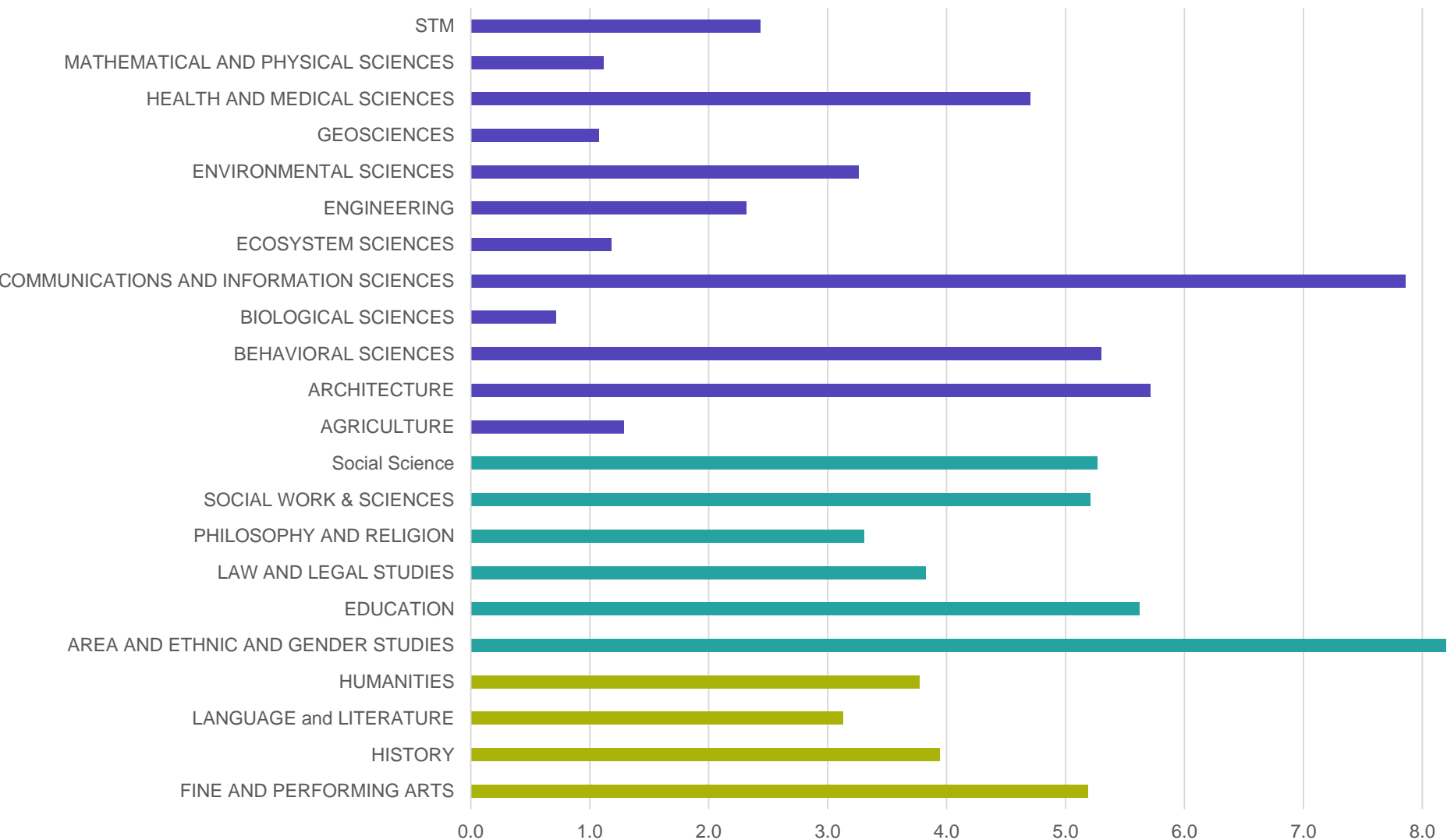
ProQuest Average Downloads per dissertation by Broad Subject Area (2014 – Current)



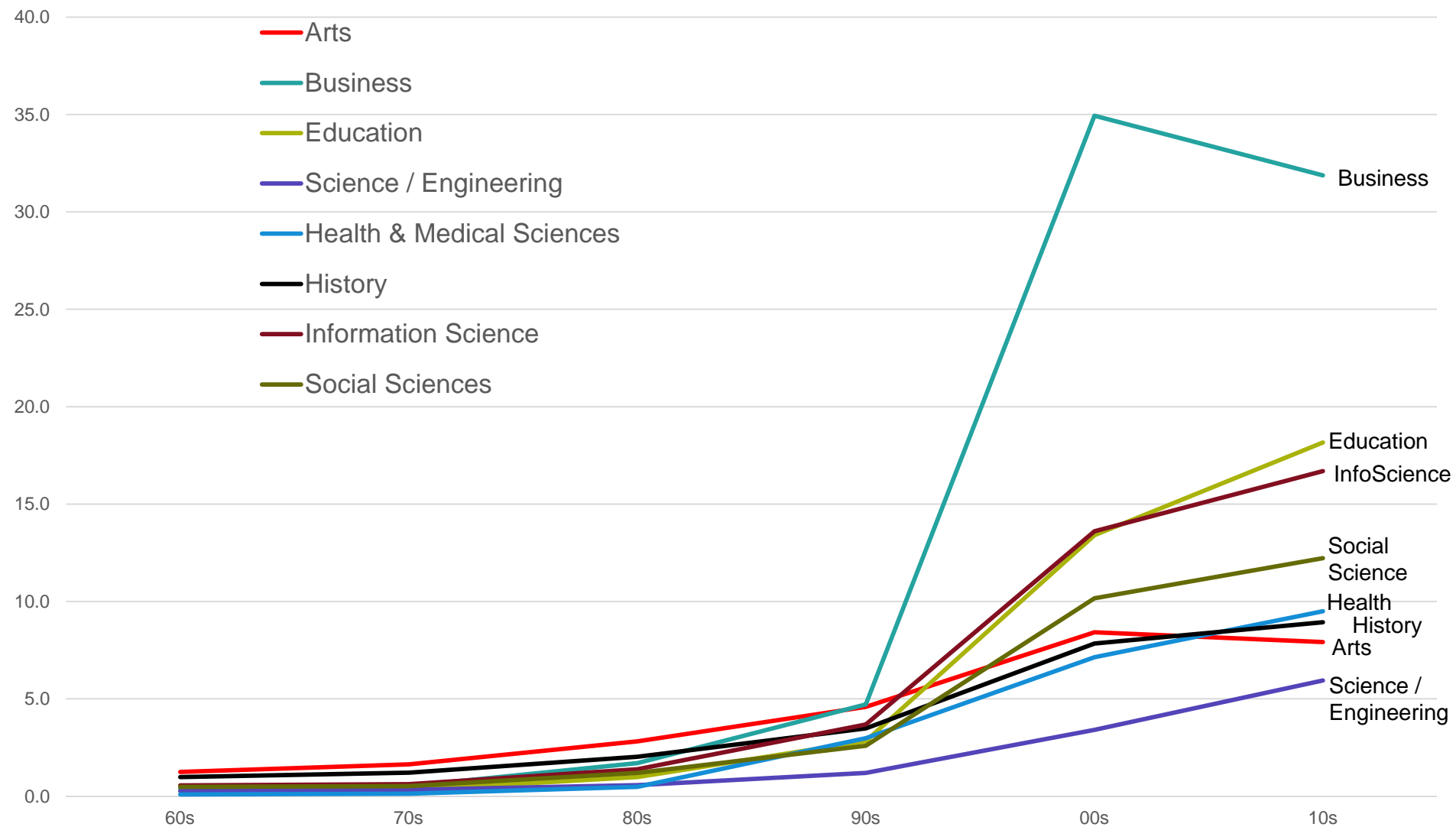
ProQuest Average Downloads per thesis (by Subject Area)



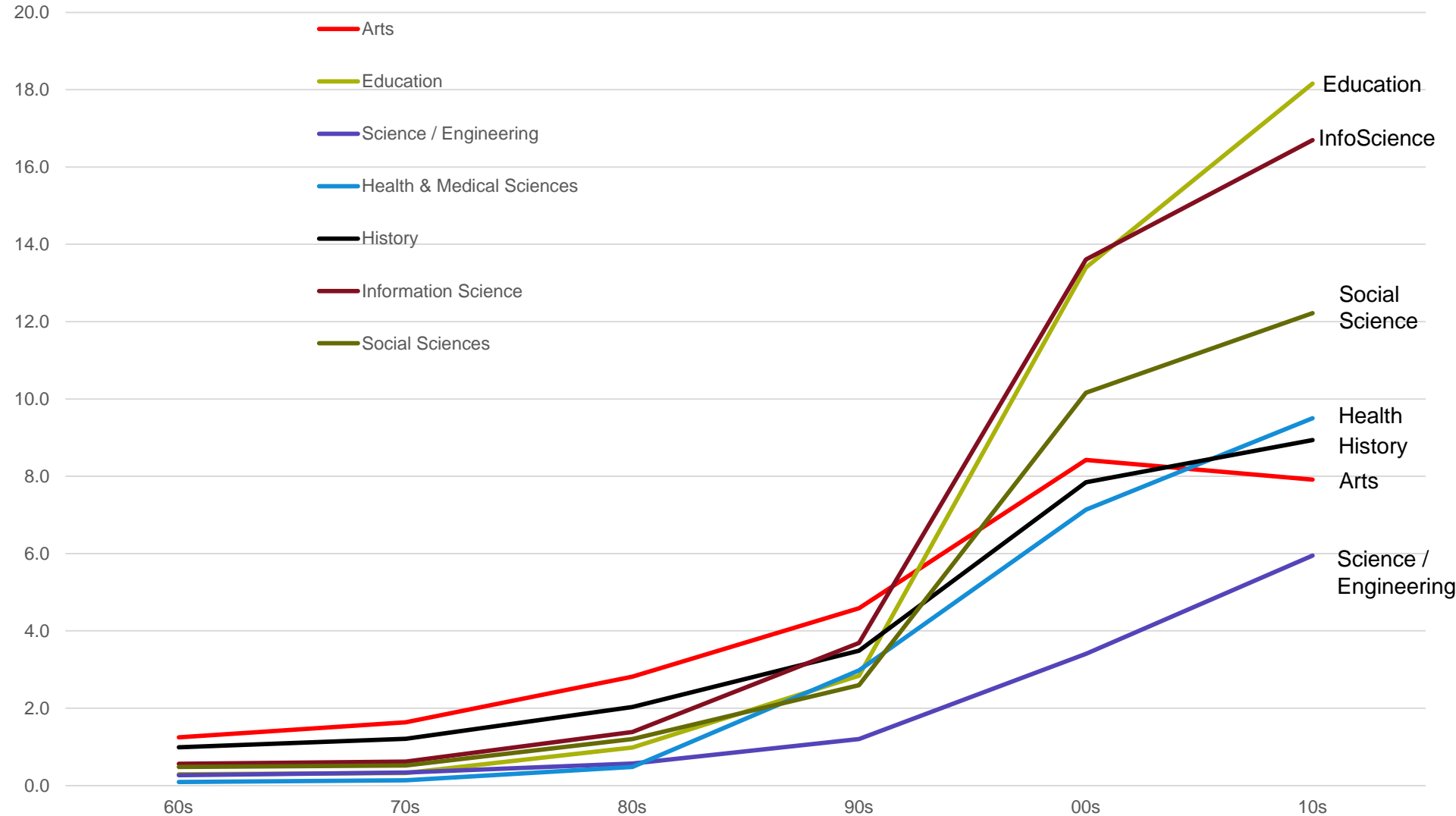
ProQuest Average Downloads per thesis (by Subject Area)

Insights from PQDT Usage

- Business is the most downloaded subject
- Social Science, Humanities and History strongly used
- Education & Information Science very strongly used
- Science & Engineering lower used – although theses from last 10 years' usage is relatively much higher

Insights from PQDT Usage

- Health & Medical relatively highly used
- Older dissertations: History, Arts & Humanities usage falls off most slowly (i.e. older dissertations are still relatively highly used)
- Older dissertations: Science & Engineering theses falls most steeply
