Founded in 1902, Fort Hays State University was originally located on the grounds of Fort Hays, a frontier military outpost.


FHSU is now a regional comprehensive public university whose mission is to develop the engaged global citizen-leaders our world needs today.

The FHSU Tigers are members of the D2 Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) conference.


