



University at Buffalo

AAU Public University with more than **30,000** students enrolled.



- Over 300 graduate and professional programs across health sciences and professions, education, architecture, engineering, business, law, arts, humanities and natural sciences.
- Approximately 40% of UB undergraduate students are Pell eligible.

Combined Degree Programs

- Increase access to master's and professional degree programs for current UB students.
- Improve affordability by accelerating the completion of both undergraduate and graduate studies.
- Increase enrollment in undergraduate liberal arts degrees as well as master's degree programs.



Outcomes

- Created more than 45 new combined degree programs.
 - 3+2 and 4+1
 Bachelor's/Master's combined degree programs.
 - 3+2 or 3+3 or 3+4
 Professional Partnership Programs.
- Increased enrollment in combined degree programs from 750 in Fall 2019 to more than 1,750 in Fall 2024.



Bachelor's/Master's Combined Degree Programs

- Combined degree programs offer a condensed format, accelerating the completion of both undergraduate and graduate education.
 - Occupational Therapy BS/MS allows students to enter the field as occupational therapists in five years and is supported by accreditation standards for licensing in the field.
 - UB offers seven combined MBA options that take five years.
 - UB Teach offers an accelerated path from 17 undergraduate liberal arts majors to a New York State professional teaching certification within five years.

Professional Program Partnerships

- Students spend less time in school and have lower overall tuition costs.
 - 3+2 Combined degree with the MSW.
 - 3+3 accelerated BA/JD offered with eight different undergraduate majors.
 - 3+4 combined degree with PharmD offered with four undergraduate majors.



How the Programs Work

Combined Bachelor's/Master's

- Course substitution: Replace 12-15 undergraduate major or elective credits with graduate credits.
- Junior year admissions: After coursework and/or program level GPS requirements have been met.
- Some programs have the option of first year or transfer admissions.

Professional Partnerships

- Begin professional degree after junior year, with the first year of the professional degree counting towards the undergraduate major.
- Junior year admissions: through an application process.
